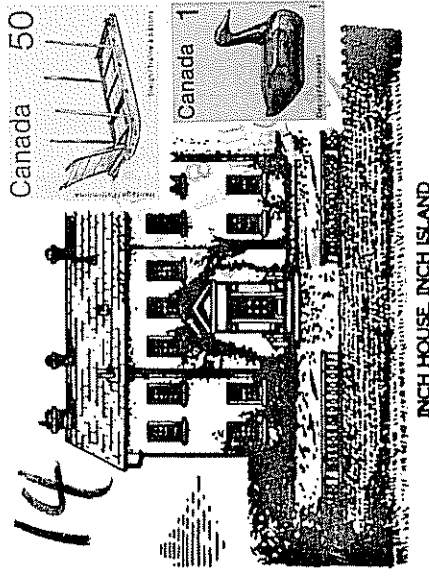
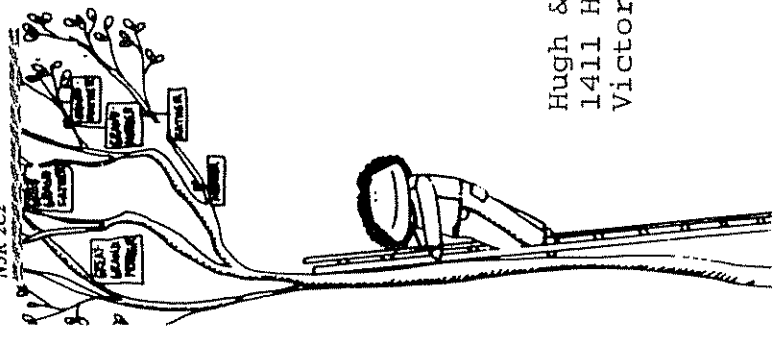

INCH HOUSE, INCH ISLAND

**ROUTE:** When you get back to the Causeway, keep straight ahead to Inch Pier. Don't leave the island without visiting the world headquarters of the O'Dochartaigh Association. Drive carefully along the narrow roadway until you come to the cross-roads (with the post office on the left-hand road). Turn right towards Inch Pier and go 500 yards. The 6th house on the left hand from the cross-roads is "AR nDUTCHAS" ("Our Heritage"), now the world O'Doherty centre.

**INCH HOUSE,** a gracious 3-storey building, was built about 3 centuries ago. It is at present being purchased by O'Doherty's from around the world (mostly the U.S.A.). Occupied by Pat Doherty of Michigan since April, 1985 it is now being furnished and equipped to receive visitors. It houses the O'Doherty genealogical records and the claim archives and membership files.

IMPORTANT DATES AND EVENTS IN CLANN HISTORY.

- 1209 A.D. David O'Dogherty (Daidhead O'Dochartaigh) was slain. The clann's first movement into Inishowen.
- 1252 A.D. Conor O'Dogherty, Chief of Ardmiodhair, died.
- 1349 A.D. O'Neills and O'Donnells great force defeated by the people of O'Dogherty.
- 1439 A.D. Donal O'Dogherty succeeded his brother as chief of Inishowen.
- 1520 A.D. Gerald, son of Donal, son of Felim O'Dogherty was appointed Lord of Inishowen
- 1600 A.D. John Oge (the younger) O'Dogherty led a small force against Sir John Chamberlain of Derry. English were sent out to prey and plunder into O'Dogherty country. The large force of English were defeated following a fierce conflict and the Colonel and most of the others slain by O'Dogherty.
- 1608 A.D. Cahir O'Dogherty, severely insulted by Gov. Paulett of Derry, rebelled against English rule, killed the Governor, destroyed Derry and with clansmen McDavett, (McDaid) hunted down the English throughout Derry, Donegal and Tyrone. Four thousand English were sent up to control this Audacious Traitor. Cahir was later killed and the Innishowen was lost to the O'Doghertys.
- 1609 A.D. 6000 O'Dochartaigh's shipped out in chains to fight for the King of Sweden.
- 1622 A.D. Phelim O'Doghertie pays rent to Sir Chichester for land formerly owned by his clan.
- 1700 - 1900 .... mass exodus of clan out of Ireland.

From 'Ar nDutcas', the newsletters go to Derry for reproduction. Then back to Inch when I hope to get several Doherty youngsters to put these together.

The time necessary to get this newsletter to you will be quite lengthy. No computer print-outs of addresses are now available. We will go through the card index files, fill in recorded years that dues were paid, address each copy and stamp (sometimes 5 stamps each). They then go to the post office, a few miles away (sometimes by bicycle)

- 1922 A.D. William-O'Doherty of Elphin, Co. Roscommon, Joseph Doherty of Mt Charles Co. Donegal, Michael O'Doherty of Abbey St. Roscommon and Patrick H. Doherty of Carndonagh, are examples of O'Dohertys not found lacking in their country's hour of need. All were fighters in the I.R.A.
- 1926 A.D. Birth year of Derry's Paddy Doherty Bogside, and Patrick Dougherty of Inch Island (formerly of Attica, Mich.)
- 1978 A.D. Reunion of the O'Dohertys of Inishowen (in Bunrana).
- 1981 A.D. First international clan reunion. Held in Attica Michigan, attended by over 500 clan. Organized with help from Marg and Stan Daugharty of St. Thomas Ontario and Matt Dougherty of Lapeer. Guest speaker was Paddy Bogside. Eileen his wife (a Mc-Daid) accompanied him from Derry. A unanimous vote was in favour of a 1985 reunion in Derry, following Paddy's invitation from the mayor of Derry. We also became a family association in 1981.
- 1982 A.D. The Derry and Donegal committee of O'Dohertys host 3 north American clann members to promote the '85 reunion.
- 1983 A.D. Barnesville Ohio the site of the 2nd international reunion. Hosts: Ruth Hogue Ohio, Betty, Earl and Betsy Hartley, Ohio Ed Dougherty W.V. all of Family group 83.
- 1985 A.D. International Reunion held in Derry city and Donegal, Ireland. Attended by Spanish, Australians, New Zealanders, Canadians, French, English, Scots and Americans. Hosted by the Irish O'Dohertys of the north and the Republic. From 4-5 thousand in attendance.
- 1990 - International Reunion to be held in Ireland

Cousin Pat has many thoughts about his return to Ireland. Here are some of them: The winters are lovely: we should have come in '86 as June was lovelier this year: this house is beautiful, but must be lived in more: there is plenty of room (and work) for more retirees: membership dues are not coming in: this Irish clan is so very proud to have a headquarters (a rallying centre): autos are terribly expensive to operate in the Republic: beware of stamp duty tax: clan merchandise not moving very good: spring and summer visitors are a blessing to our B & B business and sales of clan materials: the soil on Inch is exceptional; flowers grow great, so do weeds, sunsets and sunrises are breathtaking: Ar nDutcas is an array of blooming colours; the beauty of Inch wins all; gotta get out in a boat on the Swilly: Kelly's (border collie) a cute addition to our Inch family: Living here is expensive, the American dollar keeps dropping. I quickly received a nickname 'Pat the Yank', then they heard I had Kelly blood maternally, so I became Pat Kelly, but with a lot of Pat Kelly's around, that was confusing. Now nobody will tell me what I'm called. This worries me!

## State Chapters.

In an effort to do more locally, cut down on postage costs and to have merchandise more easily ordered, we are in need of state and area clan chiefs.

As an example; In Michigan, we have 2 clan members willing to take over that area. They are Richard A. of Pinckney and Richard M. of Troy Michigan.

Richard M. has a computer and has done much organizing of geneological research. He has travelled extensively in the pursuit of this research, all over the U.S. and Europe. Richard A. has long been on the trail of his elusive ancestors. He has been to Ireland many times, spending last summer at Ar nDutcas during reunion time. He is a shareholder at our clan headquarters.

Mich. is one of our heaviest states in membership and can easily use 2 people as state chiefs.

## ... COUSIN PAT'S MESSAGE ...

After a trip to Donegal at Christmas 1977, I began putting together thoughts of a family association. Encouragement came from our Donegal cousins, my own family, Michigan clann and a big push from my Canadian family.

Well, here I am, 9 yrs later, sitting on Inch Island in the midst of O'Dochartaigh country wondering where to go from here.

We've come a long way in a short time, certainly further than any family organisation has ever progressed.

We are gaining membership from all corners of the world but we seem to be losing members faster. That is if we consider non-payment of dues as a cancellation of membership??

No doubt we have erred in many ways. Perhaps we've promised more than we have delivered, but we must face the situation squarely.

If you fall behind in dues payment, we must cancel. Newsletters have continued going out to you over the years and they average \$3.00 each (typing, printing and postage). But before you throw us away, remember we need you more than you probably need us. We need your pedigrees, your research and yes, your dues.

Postage, Canada, Australia, U.S. and in Ireland is horrendous. Never have dues covered the total cost of the assoc. Cousin Pat finds that in retirement he is not able to kick in to keep things going.

This letter is to this end: how successful do you wish us to be? What should we pass on to succeeding generations? and do you wish to journey down this ancestral trail with us?

The association needs more members paying dues; we need to sell more clan merchandise; we need to grow in numbers.

We've all learned from this past (85) reunion. The next will be better - our next newsletter will be out before Christmas. We will detail a memorial project for our clan and have a questionnaire about your preference for the 1990 reunion (3 1/2 yrs. away).

Fort O'Doherty in Derry is complete - The council is not in a position financially to open it as yet but the O'Dochartaigh Assoc is working out some possibilities. A dedication date has not been set. I'm very sorry not to have been able to tell you more about this beautiful structure.

O'DONNELLS DEMAND TRIBUTE

Having failed to pay our yearly tribute to the O'Donnells since 1606, we have been forced to take a stand.

Now that the Clann has a headquarters and an acting Chieftan, the O'Donnells have demanded the tribute of 72 cows, 112 sheep, 27 swine, 43 soldiers (for 43 days) and a partridge in a pear tree. But upon being told that there are now 4 times as many Fiamhian as Clann Daly, the delegation cooled down. Cousin Pat also informed the O'Donnell rep. that a force of 7,000 clann could be mustered alone from the U.S., Canada, under the able leadership of Brigadere General Stanley and wife Marg Daugharty could easily provide a thousand more. Uncle Pat in Australia could fly in 4 707's in 2 weeks time, Scotland could ship 5 thousand over the channel in 3 days, Spain could send another Armada, but more ably captained this time by Admiral Pascual O'Dogherty. Derry city could send several thousand, lead of course by Paddy Bogside, commander Jack of Prescott Arizona, crewed with ex sailors your clan would steam up Donegal Bay and seige the town of Donegal. Consequently we are now at an impasse - Lets hear from the clann on how to face this problem, but prepare the troops anyway, as Cousin Pat has only calmed them down with 47 Irish pence!

This partnership is registered in Ireland under corporation laws of the land. Twenty two of the 35 shares have been purchased. Some of the purchased shares are available for resale. Headquarters can be contacted if you are interested.

Inch Island Group has completed one business year and has liquidations of over 100,000 Irish pounds, with a mortgage of 12,500 pounds outstanding. Our income since organising is ample to cover monthly mortgage payments, upkeep and to make some improvements.

The executive committee would like members to be aware that the manor house, out-buildings and acreage has great potential. With the sale of more shares and with more clan purchasing time-shares, this potential can be reached.

Families are going together to purchase shares, families are getting together for big projects or small projects; all things are possible with this lovely property in the land of our origin.

Example: Jackson Daugherty of San Antonio, TX, and his family of brothers and sisters, are all excitedly going about planning to make an apartment out of a large area in the basement. They hope to start this fall. A Texas room! Jackson, bring over some 'longhorn' souvenirs!

We have a Lee floral garden in the front, we have an Australian rock garden on Doherty way, we have a Puha raised bed in the medieval garden (puha is a New Zealand vegetable) and we have room for 100's of other projects.

The Oak tree project is going great, more next time on it. Remember a memorial tree costs \$20.00. They are planted on headquarters property and well tended by your resident horticulturist.

This aggressive project can only continue with all our help. We are the only clan to attempt such an undertaking. Lets do what we can to promote it. We are badly in need of assistance now.

Derry Inner City Project Wins Prestigious Award

Paddy Doherty travelled to London to accept the London Times Royal Institute of British Architects Community Enterprise Scheme Award.

In honour of Derry's Inner City Project this award was presented to Paddy, June 17th 1986, by the Prince of Wales. After shaking hands with Prince Charles, Doherty remarked " I had no problem with this greeting as my lineage is as long as his lineage!" The O'Dohertys were the last family who, with a chieftain at their head, fought the British.

A Doherty selected as "Donegal Man of the year".

Archdeacon Thomas Doherty, 'Priest and entertainer'. Fr Tommy is a priest at Dunfanaghy, Co. Donegal. At an early age, Tom Doherty's talent to entertain was evident and throughout his priestly life he has used that talent to it's fullest so as to enrich his priesthood and the lives of his countrymen or parishioners.

MOTHER MARIA PACIS

Born Elizabeth Josephine Dougherty on April 1, 1900 in Philadelphia, she offered her life to Christ and on Feb 10, 1917 entered the community of Sisters, Servant of the Immaculate Heart of Mary in West Chester Pa. Though many of her 67 years as a professed sister have been spent in the states, she was stationed for 20 yrs in South America.

On Feb 14, 1930, Sister Maria Pacis and another sister Sister Marie Baptiste McLaughlin set sail for Peru. Sister Maria Pacis was awarded Peru's highest honour in 1951. She returned to the states then. From duties in Philadelphia to Miami, her accomplishments caused her to be elected Mother General in 1957. We will fully detail her life in our '87 Clann History.

We are attempting to get recognition for Joseph Doherty, a freedom fighter of the 1916 -22 era. Brian J, a grandson, wishes us to pursue the records of the I.R.A. and anti - treaty forces. We are working with the Mt Charles, Donegal committee. Joseph Doherty was rather forcibly told to leave Ireland in 1923 as he opposed the partitioning of the north. How well the years have supported his view, as thousands of Irish have been killed over this aspect of the 1922 agreement removing English rule from all but the north east of Ireland. Joseph is alive and well in the eastern U.S. Brian lives in Mahopac N.Y. and his family is group 994.

#### Derry Nun celebrates Golden Jubilee.

A Derry nun returned to her native parish to celebrate the golden jubilee of her religious profession in the order of Our Lady of Mercy.

Sister Mary Matthew, youngest daughter of the late Mr & Mrs William Doherty of St. Columb's Wells, and Anne Street, entered the Mercy Order in Careysford Convent in January 1931 and made her religious profession on September 25 1933. She has served in convents in Rathdrum, Drumnagh, Mater Misericordiae Hospital and St. Michael's Hospital, Dun Laoghaire.

#### Bill Doherty's Blue-Collar Freedom Fighters.

Led by a gutsy U.S. labor leader, members of a brave band of trade unionists are risking their lives to keep democracy alive in Latin America. A strapping man of 59, Bill Doherty has white hair, a full beard and bright blue eyes that make him look like Santa Claus. But he can be tough. In one day in 1980, he drove 30 miles through Paraguayan jungle to a barbarous prison in Ypacaray that few, if any, North Americans had ever visited. There he demanded to meet with 19 union leaders incarcerated for advocating democracy. When soldiers pointed machine guns at him, Doherty promptly held a press conference.

Doherty was born into the labor movement. His father was president of the National Association of Letter Carriers for 21 years. After air-combat duty during World War II, young Bill spent two years in a Catholic seminary before going to law school. Doherty founded AIFLD and, with the backing of AFL-CIO president George Meany, built it into an activist organization that now has offices in 16 countries, a staff of 56 trade unionists and an \$8-million annual budget.
