

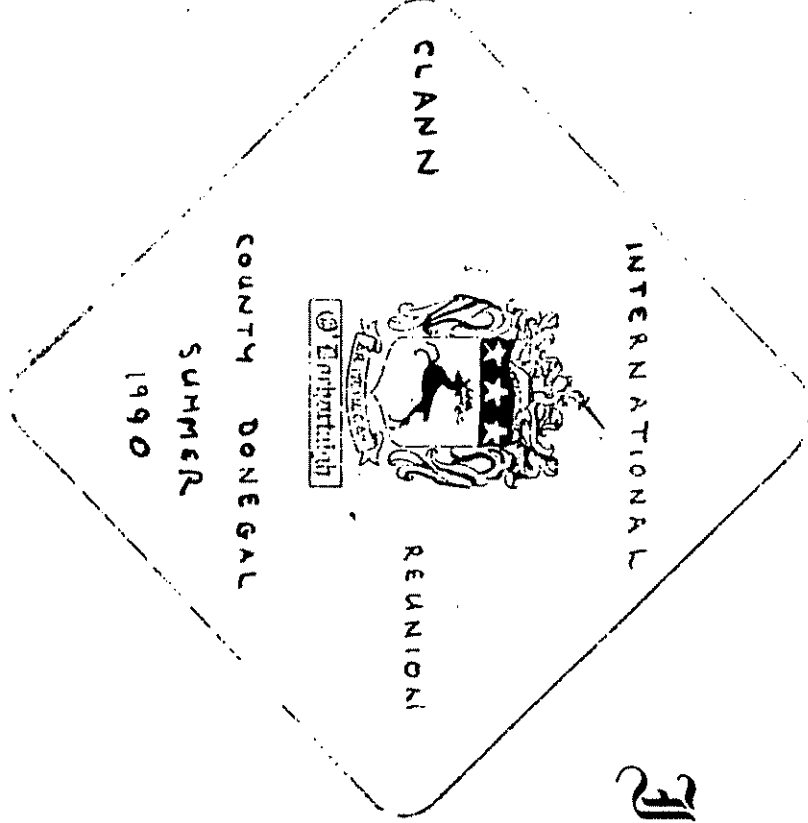

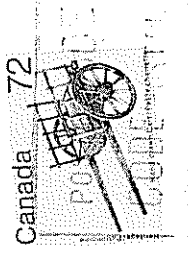
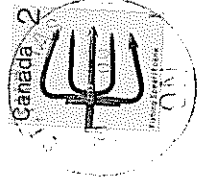

IRISH BISHOPS SEE EXODUS

Dublin, Ireland - At least a quarter of a million people have emigrated from unemployment - plagued Ireland in the past seven years - including 135,000 who are living illegally in the United States, a panel of Catholic Bishops said recently.

The panel, appointed by the Church Hierarchy in Ireland, said the emigration, mostly by young people seeking jobs, shows no sign of abating, and accused the government of not doing enough to provide economic opportunity so they remain at home.

So the real honour must go to these people who purchased shares in: this dream; this vision of the past; this allegiance to the homeland and kinship with the clann. These people come from all walks of life; many different age groups; many different spellings and from scattered regions of North America. They are:

We are receiving notoriety from the four corners of the World. From T.V. specials in Australia, Ireland and the North; magazines and bulletins throughout the U.K., European news articles and T.V. clips spread tidings of the clann. One booklet describes the Manor House thus:

Inch House, a gracious 3 storey building, built three centuries ago. At present being purchased by O'Doherty's from around the world, mostly U.S.A.

Occupied by Pat Daugherty of Mich. since April 1985 .
It is now being furnished and equipped to receive
visitors. It houses the clann genealogical
records, archives and membership files.

Inch Island was the Inauguration Place of O'Dochartaigh
Chieftans. This Island was the first land taken from the
O'Doherty's. Which led to Cahir Rua's rebellions and the Ultimate
plantation of the Irishmen by the English.

Pat Dougherty who retired from his college post of lecturer
in horticulture/landscaping in Mich. is keen to get to work on
the spacious lawns and gardens. Shares on the Manor House can
still be purchased.

" An nduthchas", why this strange hard to pronounce name for the
headquarters ? An ndutcas (with the correct celtic
pronunciation, marks) or An nduthchas (with the modern
typewriter) means, " for our inheritance". This is from the clann
crest and is the family motto

Sometimes our motto reads; Arm Dutcas (Arm Duthchas) which
translates "Vigor, Our Inheritance."

O'DOCHARTAIGH ASSOCIATION RECEIVES GRANT

Have you ever wondered why you have been receiving letters from
headquarters signed by ladies and with definite Irish Script?

We are happy recipients of an Irish Grant .The Irish
Government is aware of what we are attempting and with an AnCo
grant are assisting us in our research.

We have five young ladies between the ages of 20 -
25, putting 34 hours a week on the promotion of the O'Dochartaigh
Clann.

As of October 5 ,they have been working a month and have
accomplished a great deal. These ladies hail from the North tip of
the Inishowen Peninsula and all have O'Doherty ancestry (not
necessary but appropriate for the job.). Their week is made up of;

1. Answering mail.
2. Recording dues /merchandize /tree orders.
3. Researching birth, death, marriage and cemetery records.
4. Computing ancestor charts.
5. Assisting with Newsletters.
7. Assisting with Clann History Books.

They visit parish record offices. Thus far Malin, Lagg, Malin Head
and Moville has been researched for birth, death, and marriage
records.

These are being indexed and will be computerized. We hope to
add one more workers on Dec. 9th. The five working with us now
are;

Anne Byrne, Malin.
Rosanne Bonner, Culdaff.
Mary P. Mc Laughlin, Drumaville.
Bridget Mc Gonagle, Carrndonagh.
Mona Hunter, Malin Head.

They will work nine months .By then we hope to be able to retain
some for permanent help. With the reunion coming up headquarters
will be busy indeed.

In Newsletter 15, it was mentioned that the O'Donnell clann was
claiming back tribute from us. We had ceased paying tribute to
them following the "Flight of the Earls" in 1607.

The payment was in cattle, sheep, swine and soldiers
annually.

When the clann Daly, (O'Donnells) realised we were not
sending tribute they sent this message (in early 1610), "Pay us
now, or else!" Our chief sent back a messenger with this retort
"come and get it, but if you do.....!"

So over the centuries there has existed a stalemate. But a
lady in Ohio has decided that a debt is a debt and should be
confronted.

She has purchased the necessary animals from the rich
farmlands of Ohio and at her expense is having them shipped to
Donegal.

Ruth Roman of Warren Ohio has notified headquarters of her
intent and wishes us to prepare for their arrival.

The war council will meet in January to decide on a fitting
ceremony.

streams of Donegal.

a sister to Philip; Patricia Doherty Honneau, and Philip's
daughter, Sheridan Doherty.

"Facts of Life"

Out of the first 3200 clann births recorded from North Inishowen
we find every third has either a father or a mother as a
Mc Laughlin.

Stranger still, in 3 out of every 10 births, we find that
both the mother and the father is a Doherty.

So if your blood goes back to Donegal, and most all of ours
does, you stand a good chance of having Mc Laughlin blood in your
veins. Your ancestors also stand a good chance of doing double
dipping! (Doherty marrying Doherty).

AN ENCHANTED CASTLE

The enchanted castle of the O'Dohertys has a fabled existence off the Donegal coast, and far out on the Atlantic Ocean. It is invisible to all except those bearing the name of the former chiefs and clansmen of Irishmen. The description of the castle and many outbuildings makes one realize that these are of a Celtic origin. The rocks are laid dry, roughly placed but with walls very thick.

Only a few have passed down descriptions of the interior of the main castle. Heavy oak beams, some thirty inches thick, support various ceilings and walls. Heavy, roughly hewn furniture abounds throughout the castle, wings and guard structures. The last two clans to visit the castle were Donal in 930 and David in 1490. The island with the castle on the East Cliff has been viewed by 18 clans since then but would fade away into the mist before any landing could occur.

There is always the banner flying in the breeze (with the springing stag). Horsemen guard the harbour, Bowmen patrol the castle parapets and there is always the lilting music of 100 harps to greet the ear from 10 miles away.

This is true of an O'Dochartaigh who makes us all proud and honoured to be one. Dennis Patrick Dougherty, Jr., an Edgehill, (near Philadelphia), volunteer fireman and student at La Salle college, Philadelphia, PA., unselfishly gave his life to save 13 fellow fraternity brothers. When fire broke out in his fraternity house 19 year old Dennis thought first of saving the lives of his comrades. After ushering these students from the house he returned to be sure all were evacuated. A resulting explosion took his life on that early morning, November 9th, 1982.

This month on Nov. 9th at the O'Dochartaigh headquarters in County Donegal the Pennsylvania room will be officially dedicated in a ceremony to honour the memory of Dennis Patrick Dougherty, Jr.

This remembrance was the sentiment expressed by Dennis's parents, Marie and Dennis P. Dougherty of North Hills, Pa., upon purchasing a share of An nDuthchas while vacationing here this summer.

The clann O'Dochartaigh respond to parents Marie and Dennis; to sisters, Julie and Marianne; and to brothers, James, Patrick and Joseph with heartfelt sympathy for this loss of a loved one. We are so proud to have this opportunity to share in the dedication of this memorial to Dennis, which will be very much in evidence and visited by thousands of clann.

OUR WORKING VACATION IN IRELAND

My sister Doris, her husband Robert E. Lee and I landed at Shannon May 14, 1987 which was the start of several weeks of an Irish experience.

We were to land in London first but due to fog there, we landed at Shannon hours early and there was Paddy Inch waiting. He loaded us in the company car and headed for Donegal. It was a relaxing trip with all enjoying the pastoral scenes north to Inch Isle. The crowded car made us wish for a larger auto with greater luggage capabilities.

It is always a thrill to view Inch Island off the Irish coast and even more so to view the winding rhododendron lined on the side of the road up to the manse. A lump always comes to my throat when our headquarters comes into sight. Hattie Daugherty Brown, our mom, never saw Ireland. When our clann acquired this 265 year old manor house the Lord surely had a hand in it, maybe Hattie too!

Helen Daugherty Allen, a clann member from the Hague and Ivy Duffy Doherty from Oregon were the welcoming committee.

Helen was spending 10 days assisting Pat in the office with correspondence, Pat was badly in need of help. He found Helen to be tactful, careful and efficient. Helen returned to Holland soon after we settled in.

Ivy was at Inch for many months assisting with the cooking, working on floral beds, organising the newsletter and editing Clann History III, but her abilities at the piano were exceptional.

At a Spring Clann committee function Ivy and four other clann musicians entertained in professional style at the Manse, till the wee hours of the morning.

Some of the projects Doris and I worked on were
1. Establishing floral beds .2. Transplanting in the greenhouse.
3. Cooking dinner. 4. Kitchen Clean up. 5. Pruning. 6. Planting Vegetables. 7. Tree certificate printing. 7. Organising plants for the new nursery.

What was so enjoyable about planting the floral areas and the vegetable gardens was the wide selection we had to plant from. Pat had the greenhouse full of perennials, biennials and annuals of all colours and heights.

Bob built another sink, got water into the greenhouse, piped water to the nursery, hauled wood for fuel, worked on repairs in the house. He also took measurements of our 130ft outbuilding and will have plans drawn up to convert it into apartments. We have the only B & B on the Island and business is expanding yearly.

There are several reasons why I want this story to be told. Plan on a Summer or Spring, Winter or Fall at headquarters. Become a time-sharer and build up to a share in this venture. There's plenty of bed room, different kinds of work projects, plenty of traditional music to hear and it's all Irish.

TRIBAL GREETINGS FROM AUSTRALIA

(Uncle Pat Dougherty)

"We are back in circulation after a very sad year . My wife, Mary, died on August 31st. Her health had not been good for quite a while- even in Ireland at the big gathering. It was Mary who began the research that spread into what we are doing today. I had often suggested that she write of those early days , amongst her papers was the editorial reproduced here-un-edited."

Editorial by Mary (Gibbons) Dougherty.

WHO LISTENS ? WHO TALKS ?

When "they" wanted to talk a little we listened with half an ear. When we wanted to talk, they were long gone. So it happened , Matthew Patrick Dougherty married Mary Gibbons in 1936. They became parents of four sons and two daughters , who began to have questions as they grew. "Dad, when did your people come to Australia ? Or were they sent ?"

So it began - a search that in 40 odd years has yielded enormous information. But - as yet - not all.

Matthew Patrick Dougherty (Uncle Pat) knew his great grandfather, Hugh Dougherty, had come in "the early days.", but his only informant when Hugh's children were gone, was Hugh's grand - daughter , dear Aunt Molly (Mary Edith), Daughter of James, only son of Hugh. -

Mary Gibbons, (now Dougherty since 1936) asked help of her father, William Francis Gibbons , a well respected journalist with many contacts. Could he help in the search for her children's ancestors ?

No word came from the Historical Society or the Genealogical Society , since we did not know when they came. So William Gibbons arranged with a friend - who was the Mitchell Librarian - for his daughter Mary to have access to the shipping logs of Mitchell Library.

It was a tremendous privilege , and of enormous interest. In the early days, records were apparently stored in the crypt of St. James Church and in the lovely and magnificent Garden Palace building in the Botanic Gardens. The records of both were unfortunately destroyed by fire (to the satisfaction of some social citizens whose ancestors had not arrived as free settlers, and who now claim ancestors in the first fleet). Therefore it was a great privilege to gain access to the closely guarded records of the library.

Mary studied the shipping lists for the months - squeezing in time on her visits from her home in Casino to her family at Darling Point. Finally, in 1952, she found her husband's great grandfather, Hugh, who arrived on the Percy in August, 1841, together with his wife Susannah, (nee Gallagher) of Donoughmore, and his four daughters, Margaret, Mary, Susan and Roseanne (an infant).

He was brought out by Silchrist & Alexander, Shipping agents of George Street, Sydney. Hugh was listed as a carpenter and joiner. He was known to have bought land in the village of St. Albans, on the Hawkesbury. His only son , James, was born there in

Doherty a former president of the letter carriers' union died earlier this year. Among a long list of other things, Doherty was a former U.S. ambassador to Jamaica.

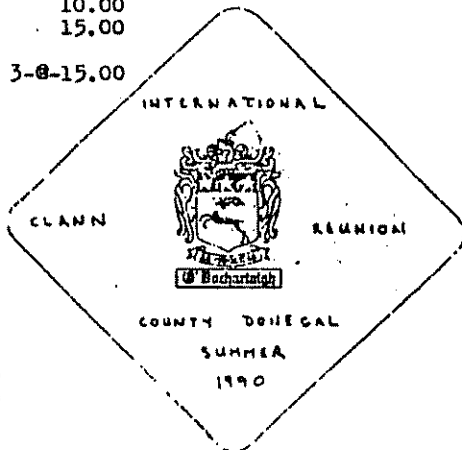

This edition is limited. It is a hard bound book, beautifully crested, (gold on green) and is exceptionally written. A book that should be read by any of you serious researchers. It is in large print, clear and concise.

Part I - involves the life and descendants of Matthew Daugherty, born in Donegal in 1771 and who emigrated to the U.S.A. before 1800. His wife's name is not known. This makes up the major part of the book.

Part II - lists the descendants of William and Robert Daugherty who arrived in New York about 1760 from Donegal. William settled in Virginia while Robert continued down to Georgia. One version of this family is that William married into the Cherokee tribe and his son and Indian wife, Sally Bunch moved westward with the same tribe. If you've heard you may have Indian blood, this may be your lineage.

Part III - gives a short version of the ancestors of Emma Daugherty Strickland of Houston, Texas. Emma has long been a member of our association. Her ancestry goes back to Donegal. A Michael Daugherty, born 1790, died in Hartford city, Blackford County, Indiana in October of 1875. Little is known of his wife, Mary Ann, other than that she was from Germany.

The book delves into the clann history very factually and is considered by our Irish clann to be a "first class - first edition".
