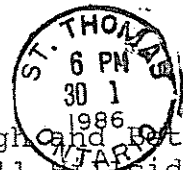

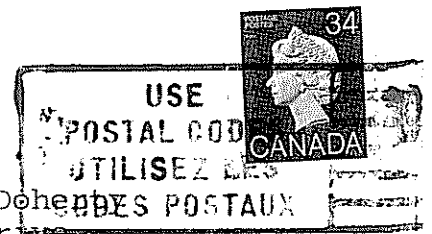

"AR nDUTCAS" (Arnewcas)

The story of our Inch Island adventure, as told by Pres. Pat

Arrived in Dublin, Ireland, April 29th, met Mr Doyle (Inch Island Group Lawyer) on the 30th. The monetary transaction for our Ireland headquarters was made to owners Mr & Mrs John Lilley. Mr Lilley wished to be with me when gaining possession of the manor house. Took a train to Belfast, then Lilley drove to Inch Island.

On May 2nd, was handed keys to this lovely Manor house, the new O'Dochartaigh Headquarters

It was spotless, and had been cared for by Bella Doherty, a neighbour. Inch was 8 miles from Buncrana, and 10 from Derry, so I stayed 3 days in Buncrana. Attended some reunion meetings and was pleased at plans. I received a ride to Dublin from Hugh and Dennis Doherty (Clark), making their weekly vegetable run.

In Dublin had 1. orders to make for the reunion 2. to get my incoming van made legal 3. to arrange for my geneology records and 4. furniture to clear customs.

On the 7th, van arrived at Liverpool, ferried over to get it (nice trip) Took off for Donegal (on the LEFT side of the road). Arrived on Inch, n tools, no clothes, no furniture. The nights were cold so stayed in Buncrana. Started mowing the knee high grass on May 10th. The video man arrived and arranged the video of the reunion. Kept mowing, grass kept growing, then on 21st of May, shipment arrived. The seagoing container 20' x 8' x 8' would not fit in the gates, parked it on the road. Jimmy and his son Eugene Doherty (Bella's family) came with tractor and trailer to assist. Charlie (Inch castle) and his hired man (Dohertys) came to help. Two men (Dohertys) on the truck also pitched in. Four hours later, the 300 boxes of books, clothing and the large filing system plus what furniture I could bring, was all in the house.

So between May 22nd and June 8th, organised what was shipped in, brought more furniture and mowed lawn. Pat Grant and Helena Downey (both Dohertys) selected all the bedding materials and had the beds ready for the arrival.

On June 9th, the first trip to Belfast airport was made and was pleased to welcome the first contigent of clan members arriving for the reunion. From Warren, Ohio was Ruth Roman, a shareholder, and her daughter, June Devlin; Stan and Marg Daugharty from St. Thomas, Ontario (who were to take over much of the house duties), Anita D. Pobocik of Grand Blanc, Michigan and Margaret Daugharty Mortin from Florida. Did these members dig in and put "Ar nDutcas" in order!

Ruth Roman purchased a lovely chandelier for the main reception room (Ohio room). What assistance these two were to the preparation of our headquarter for the big stampede. We were all very sorry to see them leave early. Stan and Marg purchased a big commercial vacuum cleaner and two wall fixtures for the Canadian area.

This was an accomplished crew, as in one week, the house was ready - a house warming party was given to these early arrivals on June 6th by a joint reunion committee of O'Dohertys from Derry & Donegal. Moira of Carn-donagh played the piano for an evening of song for the 42 people. We found ourselves at ease and in comfort at this world headquarters of our clan.

We found a great "chef" among our shareholders, in Lewis Daugharty from Denver Colo. With wife Pauline, his bountiful breakfasts got us off to a great start each morning. He served up poached salmon and salmon chowder (out of this world). During the reunion, he supervised a large Texas style B.B.Q. which we threw for the hard working central reunion committee for Irish clan members.

The second wave of shareholders came in on the 15th. Dick, wife Katie and daughters Hannah and Maura. Katies parents were a welcomed addition (also from Mic.) Annie & Jack McAuliffe (a Dublin man) took part with much enthusiasm. Jack turned out to be a great Irish tenor, and Annie was a blessing in the care of the Manor house.

Our cleaning crew was made up of Marg, Jane, Ruth, Anita, Annie, Katie and Mary. Also in this 2nd wave of shareholders was Mary & Brian from Mich. John J. our acting seanachie, his wife Marian and their son John Jr all from Arizona, next, then came Don Daugherty from Louisiana (our morning dove) then from Boise, Idaho, a charming Marilyn Dougherty was in residence for 2 weeks. We also have a clan poet laureate in Mick Daugherty of Holleywood, New York, Dublin, Arkansas etc. We are in possession of Micks work here at headquarters and may publish some soon. Mick was also an asset to the running of our headquarters and lent a hand with some reunion activities.

The American van was on the road, usually with all 10 seats occupied. "Ar nDutcas" (D & T are silent) has been undergoing change both on the grounds, the outbuildings and the residence. Tis hoped to have the 5 acres as a botanic garden for the people of Innishowen to view. We have established the Manor house as a meeting place for our clan, as many large gatherings are held monthly. The young of Inch island will be entertained here over the Xmas holidays.

SUMMER OF 1986 - Lets plan ahead.

In summer (dates later) we would like to gather a crew of members to do projects at "Ar nDutcas". Project 1. Convert 3 rooms in the basement to sleeping quarters, perhaps 1 apartment, 2 bedrooms. Project 2. Work on the grounds. Tentative ideas - work 10am to 4pm 34 hrs a week. No cost for lodging; a kitty kept by workers for food. Compensation : equivalent of \$ 400 credited towards any level of participation on "Ar nDutcas" for each 34 hrs of project work.

We plan on having this program to coincide with the dedication of FORT O'DOCHARTAIGH in Derry. We will know by Feb the fort's completion date. Let us know by April if it is possible for you to come over for these projects.

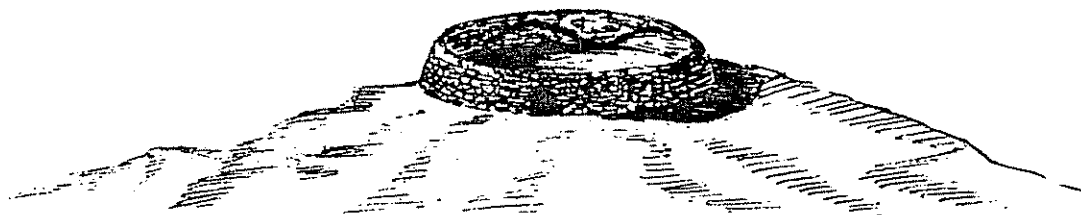
June 23, at the Grianan of Aileach, a remarkable programme was offered to our clan. The Performance was given by the great talent found in the Inishowen and the City of Derry.

REUNION RESULTS

WHICH SHIELD OR CREST? (The Spanish Connection)

Traditionally, any family coat-of-arms consists of three parts: the unique design on the surface of its "shield", a description of the "crest" above it, and the "motto" below.

The coat-of-arms most familiar to most O'Dochartaighs is that of the "Ulster stag" which is described in McLysaghts' "Irish Families" and Burke's century-old "General Armory of England, Scotland, Ireland and Wales" as follows:

Shield: "Argent, (silver), a stag springing gules (red); (above it) on a chief vert (green) (a horizontal bar), three (rare) mullets (five-pointed white or silver stars for acts of distinction) of the first."

Crest One: "A hand couped (cut) at the wrist, erect, grasping a sword all proper." This is the crest most commonly seen, but there is another in Burke: "A greyhound courant (running) ar. (argent, silver), holding in the mouth a hare, proper"; (the color of nature).

Burke further notes that in 1790 Fortescue, Ulster, allowed to Leitrim and Spanish O'Doghertys Henry, John and Clinton-Dillon, "sons of Owen (died 1784) descended from John (died 1638) second son of Sir John, Knight of 'Ennishowen', Chief of His Sept and brother of Sir Colin (Cahir) killed in rebellion, 1608" another shield, as follows:

"Argent (a silver shield) engr. ("engrailed", i.e. separated by a scalloped line in the form of a chevron), between three trefoils (shamrock-shaped, three leaved) (one in each third of the shield formed by the green chevron with scalloped edges) vert".

And another crest: "An arm in armor embowed, holding a scymitar (short, curved sword), all proper", (in natural color). Which crest is yours?

Admiral O'Dogherty reports yet another (silver) shield, this one with three groups of three blue diagonal lines descending from left to right, the middle line of each group being wider than the other two. The wide middle line of the central group splits the shield in half.

Of only the motto can one be certain: "Ar nDuthchas" (For my inheritance).

But the news to which you may not be accustomed is that in 1808 John, now a Spanish naval officer, married Maria Josefa Macedo in Redondela, Galicia, northern Spain's coast. Their first son, John, an Army Officer, married Joaquina Navajas in the same Redondela and their first son, Ramon had his lineage confirmed by the Queen's Bench in 1871. He married Isabel Sanchez in 1883. Their first son, Pascual (I), father of Admiral Pascual (II), was born in Cádiz in 1886, married Cayetana Sanchez-Zuazo in 1918 and survived to 1954. Their first son, older brother to Pascual II, is a physician-pathologist named Ramon Salvador (O'Dogherty), born in 1919. He married Catalina Fabra in 1952 and their first son, Ramon Salvador, Jr., was born in 1960 and studied law. Pascual, who has 5 sons, and Ramon Salvador have a younger brother, Angel, Doctor of History, Director of the Mexican Institute of Spanish Culture and Cultural Attache to the Spanish Embassy in Mexico City, who has three sons.

The news? Unless I've followed the wrong branches of the wrong tree, the hereditary Chief of our Sept lives, not in Ireland, the U.S., Canada or Australia, but in Spain! His name is Ramon Salvador O'D. and his heir has the same

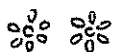
