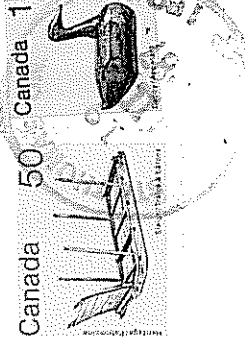

O'DOCHARTAIGH

Following Cahir's death and the rout of his army, Lord Chichester moved into O'Doherty country. It all had the appearance of a well-contrived take-over, considering the quick subjugation and subsequent enslavement of 6000 O'Dohertys, McDaid's and McCaffertys.

What's all this to do with 1987, Inch Island, Celtic Ireland and the far-away tribal family? Well, a long letter arrived months ago from Pascual O'Dogherty of Spain, wishing the Clann would promote a plan for the erection of a memorial to Cahir Rua.

Admiral Pascual is descended from the same lineage as Cahir. He is deeply interested in his Celtic Country, people and traditions. We have been hoping for a procedure and some financial backing from our Spanish Cousins. Without this we will take a questioning step. We have met with several Irish Cousins to discuss this project, and we invite your input. Ideas 'float' around: have 25-50 raffle prizes, and use the profit for the memorial. Our first raffle could be July 4, 1987, the second March 17, 1988 and the third July 4, 1988. By early '88 we could see how the idea was accepted, then proceed with the memorial. Philippe Doherty, of Paris, France, is sculpting a model for our consideration. Prizes could be many of the Clann Paraphernalia, with the top prizes being several weeks stay at 'Ar nDutcas' (The Clann Headquarters). We also must consider postage costs, Irish lottery laws, monetary difference.

Our association has run raffle schemes State-side with good success. This is a big project, but we have many thousands of people on our mailing list. Can we 'do it' for an O'Dogherty by O'Doghertys in O'Doghertie Country? Your ideas are most welcome.

### Hello O'Dochartaighs!

Just what we all need: another job, another place for our money to go? Well sit down, listen a while, and we'll discuss Cahir Rua, who gained considerable notoriety in his short span of years. (Cahir Rua: Ka-her Rowe)

Three hundred eighty years has not diminished this youth's reputation. He is revered, ridiculed, loved, scorned and still questioned. What sort of man was he? A victim of History? Of the disintegrating Celtic World? Of an english play? Or of his own weakness?

His father, John, died from battle wounds in 1601, impelling this boy, at 14, into a chieftainship, with encroaching english to the East, and intruding O'Neills and O'Donnells to the South and West. Cahir O'Dogherty walked this tightrope in the strange company of kin, near kin and foreign power. The Mc Daid's, the O'Doghertys, the McCaffertys died for him and were forced into slavery due to him. The O'Donnells who fostered him also played a hand in the final, fateful years of Cahir Rua.

We now see him as a chieftain at 14, famous in battle at 15, knighted by a foreign power at 18, and married at 19. Having been grossly insulted by an englishman, we know that his Clann, the powerful O'Dohertys, and his kin, the loyal McDaid's, entered into open rebellion against the english. A destroyed Derry, a ravaged Tyrone, a looted Donegal caused the foreign power to send 4000 soldiers into Ulster. The end came in the Summer of 1608 for Cahir, for the McDaid's, and for the Clann Fiamhain.

Cahir Rua, 'Charles the Red', was shot, decapitated, then quartered at the age 21. His head was kept on display on a pike for hundreds of years in Dublin City. This further embittered his Clann and the Irish.

Mid-January found Cousin Pat in Belfast researching our Clann. A blessing to have Clann such as Rosaleen White, who opened her house and heart to Cousin Pat. Rosaleen is an excellent cook, aided by a daughter Donna did a royal job in caring for visitors. Husband John, daughter Michelle provided steering duties. It was a pleasure to finally meet the family. All the young are setting out with remarkable goals in life. We wish them all well.

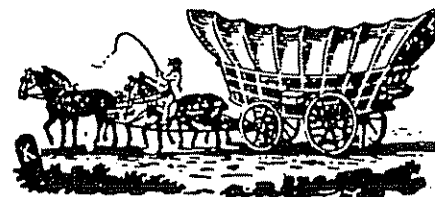
These Clann are placing their sights, tentatively, on the Spring months: a great time to have such a work-force. And may there be more!

Our Surname and the 'O'



Our name goes back to a certain Faimhain in the 8th Century. His grandson, a ferocious warrior on the battlefield, earned the name 'Docartaig', meaning 'hurtful' or 'disobliging'. His grandson took this as his surname, due to his pride in his descent from the great warrior. So we begin the lineage of O'Dochartaigh. However, we are yet referred to as the 'Clann Fiamhain'. This procedure is followed in the Brehon Law: the Clann is named after the Grandfather, Fiamhain, of the first one named (surname: O'Dochartaigh).

### WAR!

The ODoherty Clann, from World Headquarters on Inch Island (following a very successful 1985 World Reunion), has allowed the ODonnell Clann a base to issue an Injunction of Foreiture, i.e.:

Not having paid Tribute since 1607 to the ODonnell Clann, the proud ODohertys find themselves somewhat behind. ### QUERY

J.A. Westbury, 227 Montgomery Ave., Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada R3L 1T1, seeks information about his great-grandmother, LOUISA DOUGHERTY (Docherty/Dourity/Doughty/Doherty/Dority, Born: 1840's Halifax, N.S., married Michael Holland, a soldier, eventually migrated to New Zealand. Louisa may have been the daughter of John and Elizabeth (nee Stapleton), both of whose families came as Loyalists from the Carolinas. Siblings may be John, who married Lydia Hines in 1866; Ellen, who married William Lannigan in 1865; Catherine, baptized 1844.

### We Are All of the 'O'

'O' means descended from. Consensus of opinion among Historians is the the 'O' means 'Grandson of.' In the Gaelic Language the apostrophe after the 'O' is not used. Certain accent marks are employed, however, one of them being the 'faddah,' a little line, slanted up to the right. (This is a Japanese typewriter built for the English, so it doesn't have a 'faddah' on it.) In Gælic, the faddah is over the 'O' in ODochartaigh. The apostrophe is recognized as a substitute for the faddah, so we will use it. (It's on this machine.)

Why is it then that so many of us do not have the 'O'? We all have the grandfather who was Docartaig. There are several reasons: a certain foreign power attempted to squash everything Irish. It passed a law making 'Mc's' and 'O's' unlawful. Names such as McGowan (meaning a smith) were changed to Smith. Some of our ancestors simply dropped the 'O' in Ireland. Many emigrated to other countries, where they were told to drop the Mc's and 'O's'. Another law passed by the foreign power was that no Irish were to be educated; consequently, many of the emigrants were illiterate. They took the name given (spelled) by a clerk.

The 'Clerk (Clark-e of the Day' would write out the name as it was pronounced to him. We now find over 120 variant spellings of our name, and more cropping up. Information concerning the various spellings will turn up in the next issue.

### Another Congratulation

To: Rosemary Dougherty Peters. We are in possession of the Family History Book of John and Mary Agnes (nee Nulty) Dougherty. It spans 135 years and is concise and tender. It displays class and love. A job well done, Rosemary. The Book encompasses the Philadelphia, Pa. area. (See History III.)

### Inch Island O'Dochartaighs

Inch Island was the first Clann land to be taken from Cahir O'Doherty, which led to the Rebellion of 1608, after which all of Inishowen was lost. Inch was said to be more valuable than most of Inishowen. It was lost in 1608, but it will be reclaimed by the O'Dochartaigh.

The Castlequarter Dohertys farm over 350 acres. Charles and Columba raise cattle, sheep, potatoes, grain and forage. A brother, Dominic, of Inch, does carpentry work. Brother Pat lives in Derry, and John in Mayo. Charles is married to Kathleen McLaughlin; they have nine children. Maeve, our part-time secretary, is one of them.

Other Inch Clann are James and Nora, who live at Caraghan. Their two sons, who have families, also live on the Island. James II was in the last Newsletter: he donated this typewriter. Dennis and Betty are in this Newsletter.

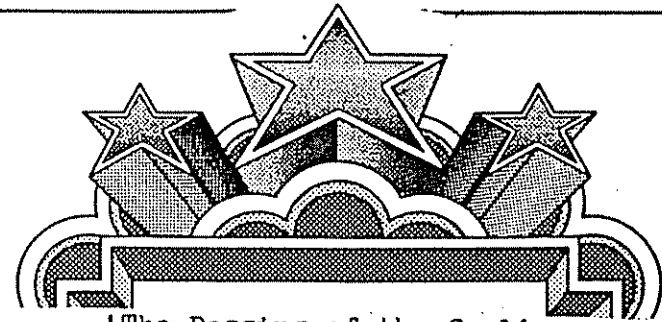
